

What you will be doing

This cleanup activity involves removing garbage on Kettle Island.



What to bring

- boat, canoe, etc. (if you have one)
- work gloves (provided if needed)
- lunch & 1 to 2 litres of water in a reusable bottle
- sunscreen & mosquito repellent
- long pants, long-sleeved shirt and a hat
- hiking boots
- raingear (just in case)
- lifejacket or PFD



What's provided

- extra water, juice & snacks
- work equipment
- protective equipment (gloves, safety glasses, etc.)
- safety equipment (hand sanitizer, masks, first aid kits, etc.)

No toilets will be available on-site, so please be sure to stop on your way. Toilets are available at the meeting site.

Field safety notes

There may be poison ivy and prickly vegetation on the property. Closed-toe footwear, long pants and long-sleeved shirts will limit your exposure. Your event leader will help you avoid these plants where possible.

There may be ticks, which can carry Lyme disease. Tucking your pants into your socks and your shirt into your pants can limit your exposure.
